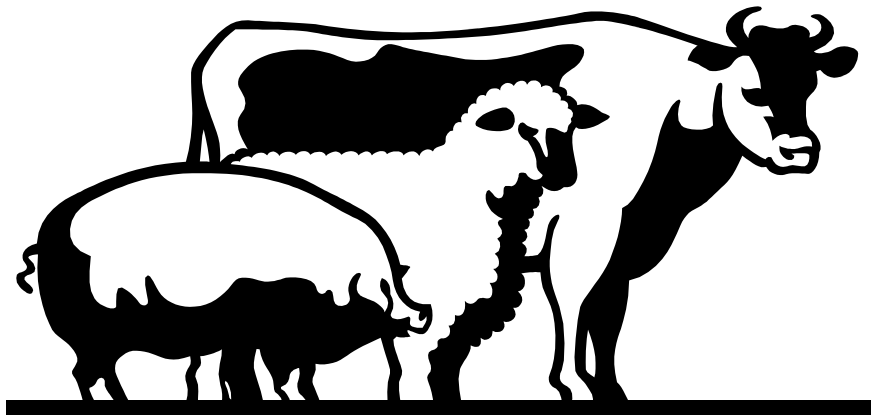

Heritage Animal Application and Scholarship

Interested high school junior and seniors may apply to the Nevada County Fairgrounds Foundation for a scholarship to raise a market lamb to be exhibited and sold at the 2011 Nevada County Fair at the Junior Livestock Auction.



Criteria

- Applications must be received by June 1, 2011.
- The Exhibitor of the Foundation animal may also show and sell their own large market animal during the 2011 Fair.
- Recipients will receive \$500 for a lamb.
- The Foundation will pay for all expenses to raise the animal, including, but not limited to, purchase price, feed, and veterinary expenses.
- Upon purchase of the animal, the exhibitor will be advanced \$250 for expenses and receipts for expenses will be paid monthly.
- The scholarship will be awarded to recipient upon evidence of enrollment to an accredited college with a minimum of 12 units.
- The animal must be shown in a market class during the Fair and may show in showmanship. However, if the exhibitor is also personally exhibiting a market lamb, the exhibitor may only show one of the lambs in a showmanship class.
- The market animal will be sold during the Junior Livestock Auction as the last animal of the like and kind. Auction proceeds from the sale of the Heritage lamb will go to the Nevada County Fairgrounds Foundation.
- The animal shall be resold or custom processed with the other market animals.
